From the Rabbi's Desk

Long live President Katz!

Dear Friends,

Here's how the Torah describes King Solomon's inauguration as the successor to his father, King David:

Then the high priest Zadok, and the prophet Nathan, and Benaiah son of Jehoiada... had Solomon ride on King David's mule and they led him to Gihon. The priest Zadok took the horn of oil from the Tent and anointed Solomon. They sounded the horn and all the people shouted, "Long live King Solomon!" All the people then marched up behind him, playing on flutes and making merry till the earth was split open by the uproar. (I Kings 1:38ff)

On Sunday, June 8th, CAA elected a new president, Selena Katz. As anyone who was there will tell you, the similarity between the coronation of King Solomon and the inauguration of Selena's presidency was uncanny. Our immediate past president, Roye Ginsberg, led Selena into the sanctuary on a pony (the mule was on vacation). Once Selena dismounted and was standing in the middle of a giant blue tarp amidst the pews, I took a carafe of extra virgin olive oil from the kitchen and poured it on her head. Then we made enough noise and danced so merrily that by the end of the morning CAA's basement looked like waters from the deep had seeped up through the earth and wreaked havoc.

Okay, I'm exaggerating. But we did elect Selena as our new president, and the basement was a mess following a week of remediation. (By the time you read this, the repairs and renovations should be nearly complete!)

As CAA's president since 2022, Roye was our first

post-COVID president. As such, he was the first president whose board meetings were all conducted using our hybrid approach of in-person meetings coupled with online participation. During his presidency, applying this same hybrid approach to services was no longer novel; it was already well-established as the new normal. Roye is to be commended for embracing the technology we became familiar with under Covid and making it a regular part of how we build community unencumbered by whatever obstacles people face to gathering in our building.

Roye and I met weekly for most of his presidency, part of his job as my supervisor. I would tell him about the work I was doing, and he would seek out my thoughts on whatever challenges our community was dealing with at the time. I came to know Roye as a truly kind person whose concern for our community and the Jewish people runs deep. At the beginning of his presidency, Roye was also still teaching religious school, an indicator of how committed he is to our children's Jewish learning. (I've spent my entire life either as a member of a synagogue or a teacher in a synagogue, and as far as I can recall, Roye is the only synagogue president I've encountered in all those years who had served as a regular Hebrew school teacher while he was president!) I will miss my regular Thursday meetings with Roye, but I look forward to strengthening our friendship while our dogs play together.

In our weekly meetings, I would sometimes exhaust Roye by bombarding him with a million ideas that came to me since the previous Thursday. Having begun to work with Selena as she gradually assumed the role of president over the past few months, I can totally relate to how I made Roye feel. Selena is bursting with energy and enthusiasm. There isn't a single aspect of governance or the functioning of the synagogue that she isn't excited to take on. There isn't a single member or prospective member she isn't eager

to meet. Her excitement is infectious, and I can already see board members and committee chairs revving up for the year ahead. I, for one, am excited to see what we as a community will accomplish under Selena's leadership. I know you join me in wishing her much success (and longevity!) in her presidency.

Once the pony (or the mule) is back in the barn, the horns have gone silent, and the earth has been repaired, let's all pledge to be the best partners with Selena we can be to help CAA flourish.

He will be coordinating our synagogue calendar of events for the various lectures, classes, concerts, book club, and a scholar in residence weekend. At the Annual Congregation Meeting we discussed having pop-up events because of the number of interesting ideas that have been suggested by our

members.

David Kochman, with assistance from Malcolm Katz, has been working closely with the remediation and construction managers of Flood, Fire Pro. Flood, Fire Pro is the company we hired to repair the damage on the bottom floor of the synagogue from both current and past flooding. David will be sending updates about the progress of the repair process. The construction will be completed in time for our 56th Annual Kosher Q on Sunday, August 10th.

Additionally, I am looking forward to seeing all of you at the Summer Picnic at Paul and Elaine Bieber's house in Fitzwilliam on Sunday, July 20th.

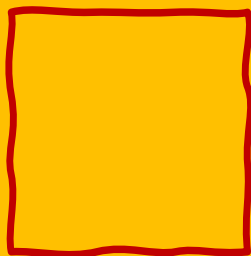
Tisha B'Av Service at Ashuelot River Park

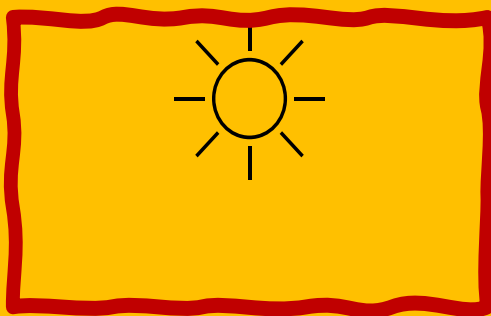

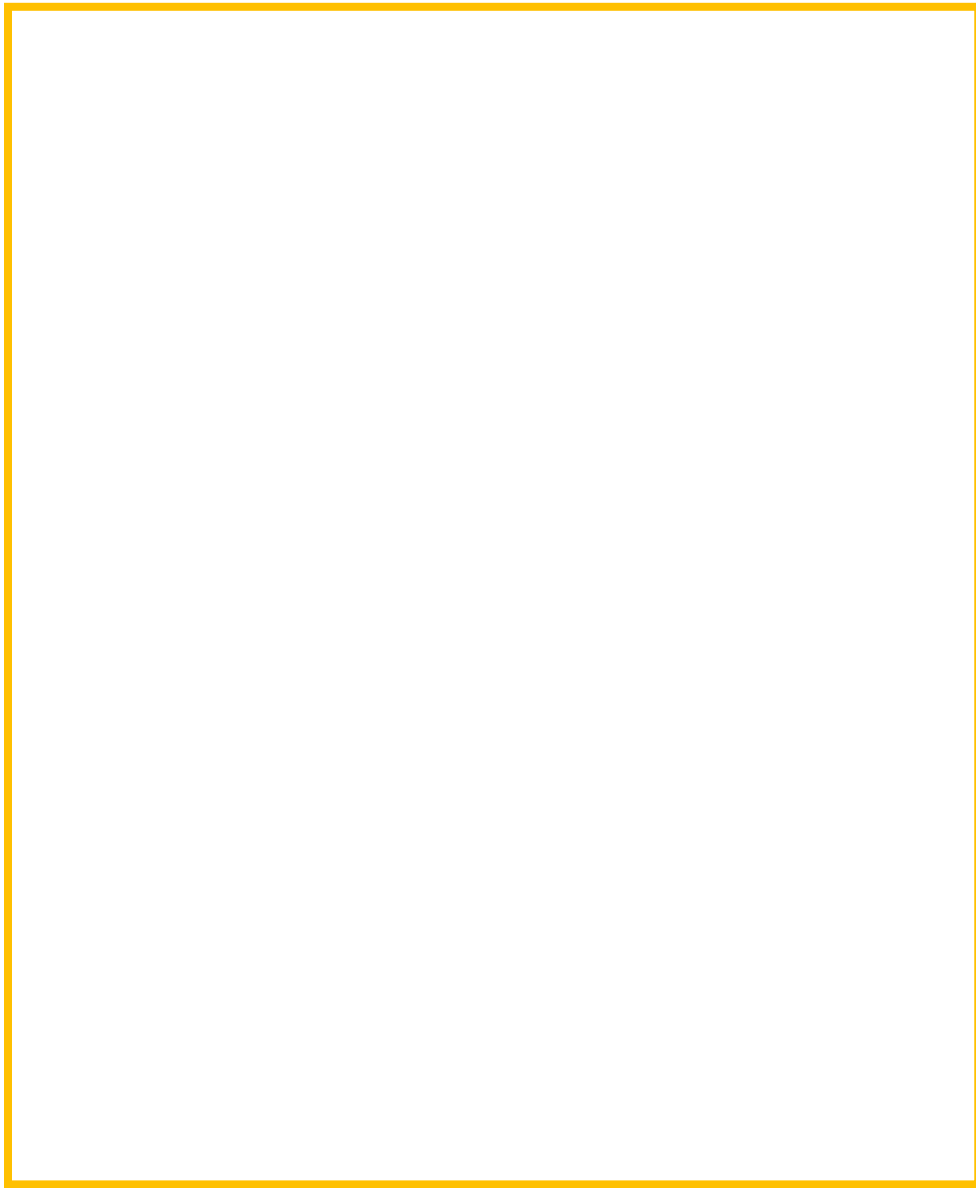
